# **Fundraising:**

We just finished up 2 fundraisers at the fair these past 9 days. Students and parents alike worked hard to support our band. THANK YOU! **Kiwanis Chicken Booth:** We will let you know when that money comes to the band and how much each student earned for their shifts. **Grandstand Gate:** This fundraiser was new this year and money will be going to the General Fund for the band to keep our fees low! As an incentive we offered a drawing each night to win \$50 in band fees or a gift card. #### **NEW Fundraiser:**

We are having a CAR WASH! Not just one, but TWO this month (and one next month!) They will be held at Advance Auto on 25<sup>th</sup> Street (across from the Ice Rink). Each section is assigned to work a day. The first one is **JULY 23<sup>rd</sup> from 10am – 2pm** that the BRASS section will work. The other car wash dates are **July 30<sup>th</sup>** WOODWINDS and **August 13<sup>th</sup>** PERCUSSION/GUARD. They are also **from 10am-2pm**, so save those dates to come work the car wash fundraiser! We will also be selling a lunch combo (Hot dog, chips and drink) for customers to enjoy while they sit in the shade and get their car washed by our students. The money collected for this fundraiser will be going to the General Fund. We will need people to work the car wash and lunch stand. This fundraiser helps keep our band fees low, so come out to work and support the band and the kids! Bragging rights to see which section brings in the most money!

# **Drop off, Pick up & Parking:**

Drop off your student at least 15 minutes early (30 for pit) for practice. The start time is when they are expected to begin practice.

Pick up your student 15 minutes later (30 for pit) than the listed time practice ends. Times listed are when practice ends, we need to allow time for them to return to the band room to put things away and have a brief section meeting. Some sections take a little longer (like pit) because they have more equipment to put away. **DO NOT** wait for your student to call you to say practice is over. Some students will just sit around and talk. The directors, staff and other parents want to go home as well. If practice is scheduled to be over at 9pm please be at the school by 9:30pm. If your student hasn't come out by then, please come in and we will find out what the delay is.

#### PLEASE NO PARKING AT THE CURB

For the safety of all, we ask that you do not park at the curb outside the band room. As the season goes on, it gets darker by the end of practice making it even more difficult to see students daring out after practice. We try to put cones out as a reminder, but we are not always able to get them out. Please help us and park in the parking spots. In the long run, you will get out sooner than if you lined up at the curb.

#### PLEASE NO PARKING BY THE RAMP (at North)

This area next to the band room needs to be clear for the pit to roll their equipment in and out of the building.

# **Band Camp Survival:**

Band Camp is two weeks of focused learning of the music and drill for our show. Kids are outside for a lot of the time, so we want to make sure that they are prepared for these two weeks. The week leading up to Band Camp, there are practices starting with the Guard only on Monday July 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> then the FULL BAND on Wednesday – Friday from 5:30pm-9pm. Start drinking an extra glass of water a day to be ready.

Breakfast will be available for students both weeks through BCSC.

Week 1 of BAND CAMP: Monday – Friday 8am-5pm
This week we ask for First Aid staff for the week with 2 shifts per day.
Lunch options for students are: school provided meal, pack their lunch, have someone bring them lunch or they may go off campus for lunch.

Week 2 of BAND CAMP: Monday – Friday 9am – 9pm (Friday till 1pm) This week we ask for First Aid staff for the week with 3 shifts per day and 1 on Friday. We provide Lifeguard staff for the daily pool times. Lunch and Dinner are planned by the boosters. We ask for kitchen staff for lunch and dinner shifts as well as specific food items are requested in the sign-up link. On Wednesday the kids are welcome to stay later till 10:45pm for a special Ice Cream Social with a DJ that is a highlight of the week for the kids.

#### **Band Camp Survival Kit:**

1 Gallon Jug of water (yes, that big!), Sunscreen, Sunglasses, Hat, Cooling Towel, Bug Spray, DEODERANT, Extra socks/clothes, Snacks for break time, Binder/folder for music, Pens, Pencil, Highlighter, String Bag

- Boosters will be providing Sunglasses & String Bags for students.

Week 2 - Items for break time: Swimsuit & Towel, headphones, cards, pillow for a nap, etc.

# **Band Camp Tips:**

- Please eat a good, protein filled breakfast everyday! Egg, meat, cheese, etc. (Just cereal will not be enough in this heat)
- Make sure to dress light, darker colors attract the sun. (Please keep clothing modest)
- Wear socks and tennis shoes everyday! (Bring an extra pair to change into during break, it will feel heavenly!)
- Gush & Go! Every time you take a water break, drink plenty of water & apply sunscreen.
- Recognize and REPORT any sign of heat exhaustion:
  - Dizziness or lightheadedness, nausea, disorientation.
  - If you STOP SWEATING, REPORT it to an adult IMMEDIATELY!
     This is a sign of heat stroke and emergency medical protocols need to be initiated immediately!

#### **Band Fees:**

We would like to send a friendly reminder for paying band fees. Band fees are a total of \$550 for the season. We offer a payment plan to help ease the payment of those fees over time. The band program has many expenses that occur early in the season. We ask that you make an effort to pay your fees on time, or even early to help ease the payment of those expenses. If you need financial assistance, please email Mr. Muñoz. Statements will be emailed around the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month.

Fees are paid to your HOME SCHOOL (North or East).
